Natural Gardening Tips

Appreciate Diversity
A few weeds in your
lawn or a few nibbles
on the leaves of your
veggies are a sign of
a healthy garden
ecosystem.



Go pesticide-free

'Use tools not toxics'. Pull weeds and squish pest insects instead of spraying. Choose pesticide-free (untreated) lumber for landscaping projects. Dispose of old pesticides safely at a household hazardous waste site.

Soil

Start from the ground up by feeding your soil with compost and mulch. If you need to fertilize, opt for organic products. Protect and enrich your soil by using cover crops.

Water

Choose low-water use plants, then water deeply but infrequently to encourage deep roots.



Habitat

Plant natives and provide habitat for pest-eating birds and beneficial insects. Help wildlife with bird, bat and bee houses and provide water for birds and bees.

Lawn

Make your lawn an eco-lawn and replace unused turf areas with pollinator-friendly plantings.
